SCHOLARSHIP ELIGIBILITY

School Board Policy, Section 460, Student Scholarships and Awards

Students in the School district of Delavan-Darien shall be informed annually of available scholarships and awards. Senior scholarships and awards shall be available to students who have earned at least 16 credits at the end of three years of high school attendance and will graduate with the next graduating class. Grade point averages for student awards and scholarships shall be calculated using the board-approved grading system listed in the DDHS student handbook.

To be eligible for local scholarships, awards and the Wisconsin Academic Excellence Scholarship, applicants must have been enrolled full time at Delavan-Darien High School for at least two consecutive full semesters prior to the determination of recipients (end of seven semesters), except as otherwise specifically provided. For all awards and scholarships, Delavan-Darien High School students who are participating in a school-approved foreign exchange program shall be considered as enrolled students at Delavan-Darien High School.

The previous paragraph means that a student who applies for any local scholarship(s) must be registered and attend the first day of classes of his or her spring semester, junior year, at DDHS.

The District shall not discriminate in the acceptance and administration of gifts, bequests, scholarships and other aids, benefits or services to students from private agencies, organizations or persons on the basis of sex, race, religion, national origin, color, ancestry, creed, pregnancy, marital or parental status, sexual orientation, physical, mental, emotional or learning disability or handicap. Discrimination complaints shall be processed in accordance with established procedures.

SCHOLARSHIP REDEMPTION PROCEDURE

Directions for receiving awarded money:

- The student shall enroll at the school he or she indicated. Applicants must understand that any contemplated change in plans must be presented to the selection committee for approval. Such approval must be obtained to enable the student to qualify for an award.
- Amounts and payment schedules listed for scholarships are subject to change without prior notice. Availability of scholarships and amounts listed in this booklet may be based on prior year's offerings and awards.
- Applicants understand that all scholarships awarded at Commencement must be claimed in the fall (and/or spring, depending on the specific scholarship) of that same year by sending proof of enrollment to the DDHS Student Services Office **AFTER** arriving at school in September (and/or January). Please read the wording of your specific scholarship to see if it is all awarded during one year, or over a two or four year time period. Remember to include your address at the time that you request your payment(s).
- **“Proof of Enrollment” is defined as:**
 1. A fees paid receipt from the college or university. Or,
 2. A letter from the Registrar of the college or University stating that the student is enrolled as a full-time student.
 3. A copy of a student schedule or a bill is **NOT** considered proof of enrollment.
- The Delavan-Darien Scholarship program is a REIMBURSABLE system. ***DO NOT*** count on awarded scholarships to pay your bills. Plan ahead and make arrangements to cover your expenses. Payments will be made in a timely manner after you show proof of enrollment and money has been allocated by your specific scholarship donor. **Do not plan on fall payments before December—or spring payments before April.**

DIRECTIONS FOR COMPLETING YOUR APPLICATION

1. Page A: Place an “X” next to each scholarship for which you want to apply. You WILL NOT be considered as a candidate for a scholarship if you don’t indicate your intent to apply.
2. Pages B & C: Answer all questions completely. Remember this is your resume. Don’t be modest. The selection committees want to know about you – who you are, what you have done while in high school and in the community.
3. Page D: Since many of our awards are sponsored by service organizations, take the time to describe how you met the SERVE requirement. What did you learn/gain from your experiences? How have your experiences made you a better person? **Make sure all hours are documented through the Main Office before listing them on your application.**
4. Page E: This is probably the most important page of the application. Do your best. You can attach an additional page if necessary.
5. Page F: Be thorough in your explanation. Be sure to include any special factors (family changes, special needs of family members, etc.).
6. Page G: Be sure you and your parent sign and date your application. Your application WILL NOT be considered without BOTH signatures. Information regarding your GPA, rank and Conduct Code grade will be completed by your counselor
7. Neatness Counts! Sloppy or hastily completed applications speak for themselves; it doesn’t speak well for the applicant. **MRS. SCHEURELL CAN PUT THIS APPLICATION ON YOUR HOME DIRECTORY.**
8. This scholarship application is very similar to a job resume. The time and effort you take to do a good job on this application will help you in your future. Remember, if it takes you two hours to complete the application and you receive a \$500 scholarship, you have earned \$250 per hour for your effort!
9. **Applications are due to Student Services by 3:00pm, Thursday, April 14, 2011.**

SCHOLARSHIP LISTINGS

AMERICAN LEGION AUXILIARY AWARD Rutledge-Boviall-Schauf-Madison Unit 95

(Created 11/70)

1. The American Legion Auxiliary Award, sponsored by the Rutledge-Boviall-Schauf-Madison Unit 95, shall be awarded at the Commencement exercises of the Delavan-Darien High School to a member of the graduating class.
2. The award shall be based upon applications submitted by twelfth grade students who intend to further their education beyond high school. Applicants for this award may attend any type of school, for any duration of time, and may pursue any major of their choosing.
3. An applicant for this award must be the child or grandchild of a veteran.
4. The criteria upon which the candidates shall be judged are:
 - a. quality of high school work and promise as a student
 - b. ability or aptitude in the course chosen
 - c. sincerity of purpose
 - d. wholesomeness and good citizenship
 - e. community service
5. Financial need shall be a consideration only when other qualifications are considered to be equal.
6. The winner shall be selected by a committee consisting of:
 - a. the high school counselors
 - b. three members of the American Legion Auxiliary, Rutledge-Boviall-Schauf-Madison Unit 95
7. There will be two \$500 awards offered this year.
8. The award shall be paid by the Auxiliary directly to the recipient upon matriculation in the school of his or her choice.

**AMERICAN LEGION AUXILIARY AWARD Wilkins-Kelly Unit 450-
Darien**

(Created 2/12/87)

1. The American Legion Auxiliary Award, sponsored by the Wilkins-Kelly American Legion Auxiliary Unit 450-Darien, shall be awarded at the Commencement exercises of the Delavan-Darien High School to a member of the graduating class.
2. The award shall be based upon application submitted by twelfth grade students who intend to further their education beyond high school. Applicants for this award may attend any type of school, and may pursue any major of their choosing.
3. An applicant for this award must be the child or grandchild of a veteran or service-person, and provide proof of relationship with application.
4. The criteria upon which the candidates shall be judged are:
 - a. quality of high school work and promise as a student
 - b. ability or aptitude in the course chosen
 - c. sincerity of purpose
 - d. wholesomeness and good citizenship
5. Financial need shall be a consideration only when other qualifications are considered to be equal.
6. The winner shall be selected by a committee consisting of:
 - a. two high school counselors - to be chosen by Wilkins-Kelly American Legion auxiliary Unit 450
 - b. three members of the Wilkins-Kelly American Legion Auxiliary Unit 450
7. This award shall be in the amount of \$500 with payment as follows:
 - a. \$250 to be given first semester
 - b. \$250 to be given second semester
8. The award shall be paid by the Auxiliary directly to the recipient upon matriculation in the school of his or her choice.

AMERICAN LEGION AWARD RUTLEDGE-Boviall-Schauf-Madison Post 95

(Created Jan. 1981)

1. The Rutledge-Boviall-Schauf-Madison American Legion Post 95 Scholarship shall be awarded at the Commencement exercises of the Delavan-Darien High School to a member of the graduating class.
2. The award shall be based upon applications submitted by seniors who plan to enroll in any type of post-secondary school, other than a four-year college or university or the three-year school of nursing. Applicants for this award must pursue either a one-year or a two-year program of studies.
3. The award winner shall be determined by a committee consisting of:
 - a. the high school guidance director
 - b. the commander of the American Legion Post 95
 - c. one member of the American Legion Post 95 Scholarship Committee
 - d. two teachers; to be selected on an alternate basis, from the agriculture department, business education department and the industrial technology department.
4. The criteria upon which the candidate shall be judged are:
 - a. quality of high school work and promise as a student
 - b. wholesomeness and good citizenship
 - c. ability or aptitude in the course chosen
 - d. sincerity of purpose
 - e. financial need
5. All other factors being equal, the son or daughter of a veteran should be considered in the final decision.
6. The American Legion Post 95 Award shall be a one-year award in the amount of \$500.
7. The award shall be paid to the recipient upon matriculation in the school of his/her choice.

AMERICAN LEGION AWARD Wilkins-Kelly Post 450

(Created 4/89)

1. The Wilkins-Kelly American Legion Post 450 Award shall be presented annually at the Delavan-Darien High School Commencement exercises to a member of the graduating class.
2. The award shall be based on applications submitted by seniors who plan to attend some type of educational institution beyond high school. The award will be either a \$500 scholarship being awarded to a single individual attending a four-year college/university or military academy or two \$250 awards to students attending a vocational/technical school or business school.
3. Applicants shall be judged on the quality of their scholastic performance, sincerity of purpose, promise as a student and school citizenship.
4. Financial need shall be a consideration only when other qualifications are considered equal.
5. The winner shall be selected by the high school counselors and a representative of Wilkins-Kelly American Legion Post 450.
6. The award shall be a one-year award.
7. The award shall be paid by Wilkins-Kelly American Legion Post 450 to the recipient after proof of school enrollment in the fall.

AURORA HEALTH CARE AWARD

1. The Aurora Health Care Award shall be presented annually at the Delavan-Darien High School Commencement exercises to a member of the graduating class.
2. The award shall be based upon applications submitted by seniors who plan to enroll in any type of health-related field.
3. Applicants shall be judged on the quality of their scholastic performance, sincerity of purpose, promise as a student and school citizenship.
4. Financial need shall be a consideration only when other qualifications are considered to be equal.
5. The recipient shall be selected by the staff of Aurora Health-Delavan.
6. The award shall be for one year in the amount of \$1,000.
7. The award shall be paid upon proof of the recipient's enrollment as a full-time student during the fall semester.

BOHN FAMILY LEADERSHIP SCHOLARSHIP

(Created 4/97)

1. The Bohn Family Leadership Award shall be presented annually at the Delavan-Darien High School commencement exercises to a member of the graduating class.
2. The award shall be based upon applications submitted by seniors who rank in the top 10% of the graduating class and who will attend an accredited four-year college or university.
3. Applicants shall be judged on their leadership potential, community service, involvement in school activities and school citizenship.
4. Financial need shall be a consideration only when other qualifications are equal.
5. The following procedure will be used to select the recipient:
 - a. The high school guidance department and administration will provide all the application forms of the top 10% of the graduating class.
 - b. The Bohn family will review all applications and will conduct a personal interview with five to seven of the chosen.
 - c. The final selection will be made by the Bohn family after consultation with high school administration.
6. This award shall be a four-year award in the amount of \$10,000, with \$1,250 payable each semester for eight semesters.
7. Award recipients must maintain a 2.0 grade point cumulative average on a four point system and must complete a bachelor's degree within five years from the date of the receipt of the scholarship.
8. For the first semester, the award will be paid to the recipient upon proof of full-time enrollment in a four-year college or university. For subsequent semesters, proof of full-time enrollment and proof of satisfactory academic progress for the previous semester must be provided for additional payments.

BORG FOUNDATION ACHIEVEMENT SCHOLARSHIP

In order to reward achievement by students at Delavan-Darien High School and to promote their further education, a scholarship may be awarded annually by Borg Foundation, Inc., within the following guidelines and conditions:

1. In the discretion of the Board of Directors of Borg Foundation, Inc., a scholarship or scholarships may be awarded annually by the Foundation to graduates of Delavan-Darien High School who matriculate at an accredited college or university.
2. Selection of a recipient of a scholarship may be based in whole or in part upon academic achievement, participation by the graduate in extra-curricular activities during his or her high school career and upon the course of study to be pursued by the graduate at an accredited four-year college or university.
3. The income and economic circumstances of a graduate and his or her parents or guardian need not be considered in the selection of scholarship recipients. Likewise, the award of other scholarships and the availability of educational loans to a graduate or to his or her parents or guardian may or may not be considered in the granting of a scholarship.
4. The scholarship may be paid to the recipient or to the college or university in semi-annual installments as directed by the Board of Directors unless they authorize a different method of payment due to circumstances. Payments may temporarily or permanently discontinued due to an unsatisfactory academic record at the recipient's college or university, due to a change in the recipient's course of study or for any reason which the Board of Directors deems inimical to the purposes expressed herein for the granting of scholarships.
5. The amount of the award for 2010 was \$4,000. This award will be paid out in eight payments, \$500. each semester over a four-year period. For the first semester, the recipient must present proof of enrollment as a full-time student at a four-year college or university. For subsequent semesters, the recipient shall present both proof of enrollment as a full-time student at a four-year college or university program and a transcript demonstrating satisfactory academic progress for the previous semester.

GEORGE W. BORG FOUNDATION INC. SCIENCE SCHOLARSHIP

1. Scholarships may be awarded from time to time to graduates of Delavan-Darien High School upon applications submitted by twelfth grade students.
2. Scholarship awards will be awarded by and in the sole discretion of the directors of Borg Foundation, Inc., within the following guidelines:
 - a) Graduation from Delavan-Darien High School with a record of high academic achievement.
 - b) A satisfactory record of extra-curricular activity during the applicant's period of enrollment in Delavan-Darien High School.
 - c) Scholarships will be awarded to applicants who will pursue a course of study at an accredited four-year college or university in the following areas: mechanical engineering, chemical engineering, industrial engineering, civil engineering, aeronautical engineering, agricultural engineering, architectural engineering and, physics, chemistry, environmental engineering, medicine, psychiatry, psychology, optometry, ophthalmology, astronomy, zoology, biology, nursing and veterinary medicine.
 - d) The financial resources available to an applicant during his or her college or university enrollment may or may not be considered in awarding scholarships.
 - e) The Borg Science Scholarship shall be initially awarded upon recipient proof of enrollment as a full-time student in a four-year college or university program. For subsequent semesters, recipients shall present both proof of enrollment as a full-time student in a four-year college or university program and a transcript demonstrating satisfactory academic progress for the previous semester.
 - f) The Borg Science scholarship is valued at \$8,000, paid in eight installments of \$1,000 per semester.

GEORGE W. BORG AND EFFIE BORG SCHOLARSHIP

1. The George W. Borg and Effie Borg Scholarship shall be awarded at the Commencement exercises of the Delavan-Darien High School to a male or female member of the graduating class.
2. The award shall be based upon application submitted by twelfth grade students who, without such assistance, might not be able to acquire a college or university education. Any graduating senior qualified to enroll in an accredited college or university shall be eligible for the scholarship. Graduates who desire to and are qualified to enter nurse's training shall also be eligible.
3. The scholarship winner shall be determined by the majority vote of the committee established under the will of Mrs. Borg, one member of which shall be the Superintendent of Schools.
4. The total value of the scholarship varies annually. In previous years, awards ranging from \$2,000 to \$4,000 have been made. In 2010, one \$4,000 scholarship was presented. Payments will be made semi-annually over four years, with the first payment of the year occurring after October 1 and the second payment of the year after February 1. Recipients must submit transcripts showing successful college achievement prior to each payment after the initial one.

THE DARIEN WOMAN'S CLUB SCHOLARSHIP

(Created 3/06)

1. The Darien Woman's club Scholarship shall be presented annually at the Delavan-Darien High School commencement exercises to a member of the graduating class who is a resident of Darien or the Township of Darien.
2. The award shall be based upon applications submitted by graduating seniors who plan to enroll in any type of postsecondary education program.
3. Applicants for the award must demonstrate good citizenship and school and community service.
4. Financial need shall be a consideration only when other qualifications are considered equal.
5. The Darien Woman's Club shall choose a recipient.
6. The award shall be a one-time award in the amount of \$1,000.
7. The award shall be paid to the recipient upon proof of enrollment as a full-time student during the spring semester.

DELAVAN LIONESSE CLUB

(Created 5/81)

1. The Delavan Lioness Club Award shall be presented annually at the Delavan-Darien High School Commencement exercises to a male or female member of the graduating class who plans to continue his or her education beyond high school.
2. The award shall be based upon applications submitted by twelfth grade students who plan to enroll in any type of accredited post-secondary school. This could include a four-year college, a school of nursing, a business school, a trade or technical school, or any other accredited school providing training of shorter duration. Applicants for this award may pursue any major of their choosing.
3. Applicants shall be judged upon the following criteria:
 - a. quality of scholastic performance
 - b. sincerity of purpose
 - c. promise as a student
 - d. wholesomeness and good citizenship
 - e. leadership and service to the school as demonstrated by participation in the extracurricular activities of the school.
4. The single most important criterion for the selection of the winner shall be the extent of the applicant's participation in and contribution to the school's extracurricular programs, i.e. sports, orchestra, forensics, drama club, foreign language club, FBLA, etc. Community Service will also be an important consideration in the selection process. Applicants for this award need not be high-ranking students.
5. Financial need shall be a consideration only when other qualifications are considered to be equal.
6. The winner shall be selected by a committee consisting of:
 - a. the high school assistant principal
 - b. the high school guidance director
 - c. two members on the Delavan Lioness Club
 - c. four teacher advisors from the following areas of extracurricular offerings:
 1. journalism
 2. forensics
 3. fine arts
 4. athletics
7. This award shall be a one-year award in the amount of \$1,000. Payment will be made in the spring after successful completion of the first semester.

DELAVAN LIONS CLUB SCHOLARSHIPS

Given in honor of Glen Holman, Dave Curry, Doc Carroll and Mac McGinnis

(Revised, March 2006)

1. The Delavan Lions Club Scholarships shall be awarded annually at the Delavan-Darien High School Commencement exercises to members of the graduating class who plan to continue their education beyond high school.
2. The awards shall be based upon applications submitted by members of the graduating class who plan to enroll in any type of post-secondary institution.
3. Applicants for the Delavan Lions Club Scholarships shall be judged upon the following criteria:
 - a. Quality of their scholastic performance
 - b. Sincerity of purpose
 - c. Promise as a student
 - d. Leadership and Service to the school
4. Applicants must satisfy the following requirement:

The applicant must have completed 40 hours of community service as evidenced by completion of community service (S.E.R.V.E.) application form(s) in the high school office.
5. Special consideration will be given to applicants who have a 2.00 GPA or better.
6. Financial need shall be a consideration only when all other qualifications are considered to be equal.
7. These awards shall be determined by a committee consisting of:
 - a. Two members of the Delavan Lions Club (to be appointed by the club president).
 - b. One member of the high school counseling staff.
 - c. The principal of Delavan-Darien High School or designee.
8. These awards shall be one-time awards in the amount of \$1,000. For 2011, four awards will be given.
9. These awards shall be paid by the Delavan Lions Club upon receipt of a copy of the payment of registration fees at a post-secondary institution.

One of the four Delavan Lions Club Scholarships will be given in the name of Glen Holman. Glen taught Agriculture and vocational Education in the high school for more than 33 years, earning over 50 different awards. He was a member of the Delavan Lions Club for over 39 years, served as the chairman of the City Parks and Recreation Commission and was a member of the Delavan Lakes chamber of Commerce.

A second of the four Lions club Scholarships will be given in the name of Dave Curry. Dave Curry was a long time member of the Delavan-Darien community and a 65-year member of the Delavan Lions Club. He began his career in the Delavan community in 1944 as a 7th and 8th grade math teacher. He was the Principal of Park school in 1957 and was then moved to serve as principal of the newly constructed Phoenix Middle School back in 1966 and retired from that position in 1977.

The third of the four Lions Club Scholarships will be given in the name of Joseph Anthony "Doc" Carroll. Doc began his adult medical career in Delavan as an Osteopathic M.D. He lived and worked in Delavan his whole life. He was the last surviving Charter Member of the Delavan Lions club, joining to provide service to his community in 1938. He passed away in 2005, and had served as an active member of the Delavan club for 67 years.

The fourth and last Delavan Lions Club Scholarship will be given in the name of Delbert (Mac) McGinnis. Raised in Clinton, decorated Bomber Pilot Veteran of WWII, educated at UW-Whitewater and UW-Madison. Mac became the superintendent here in 1968. During his tenure, the district was consolidated into what is now known as the Delavan-Darien Schools. He worked to increase the district libraries, add space for vocational education and built the first administration center. He retired in 1986 and remained very active in the Delavan Lions club until he passed away at 81 in 2005.

One student will be selected to receive a scholarship in the name of each one of these outstanding Delavan Lions Club members. These recipients are those who meet the stated general requirements and best exemplify outstanding service characteristics.

DELAVAN SOCCER CLUB SCHOLARSHIP

(Created 3/05)

1. The Delavan Soccer Club Scholarship shall be awarded at the commencement exercises of Delavan-Darien High School
2. One \$350 scholarship shall be awarded to a graduating senior female who has participated in Varsity Soccer at Delavan-Darien High School and will be attending either a technical school or a four- year university.
3. One \$350 scholarship shall be awarded to a graduating senior male who has participated in Varsity Soccer at Delavan-Darien High School and will be attending either a technical school or a four-year university.

DELAVAN-DARIEN EDUCATION ASSOCIATION AWARD

The following is a recommendation from the Scholarship Committee to the Representative Assembly of the DDEA - presented 3/29/82.

1. The DDEA Award shall be awarded at the Commencement exercises of the Delavan-Darien High School to a graduating senior who has expressed the desire to enter one of the public service professions that requires a college degree.
2. Applicants must satisfy the following requirements:
 - a. The applicant must have been a student of Delavan-Darien High School for at least two years.
 - b. The applicant must rank in the upper 1/3 of his/her class.
 - c. The applicant must have participated in at least two independent fields of co-curricular activities.
 - d. Any recorded incident of misbehavior or other forms of poor school citizenship will eliminate any applicant from consideration.
3. The award will not be given if, in the opinion of the committee, no candidates meet the minimum requirements as set forth in (2).
4. Applicants will be judged by members of the committee on the following points:
 - a. self control
 - b. cooperation
 - c. respect for others
 - d. personal habits
 - e. sportsmanship
 - f. dependability
 - g. punctuality
 - h. truthfulness
 - i. initiative
 - j. attitude

All other factors being equal, rank in class of the applicants will be the determining factor. Financial need is to be considered only when the above qualifications are equal.

5. The DDEA Award shall be a two-year award of \$500 per year to the recipient. The recipient must maintain an acceptable grade point average in the first year of the award in order to be given the second year of the award. Application for the second year of the award must be accompanied by a transcript of grades for the first year. The DDEA Scholarship Committee shall be the final authority regarding the second year extension of the award.

DELAVAN-DARIEN FRIENDS OF THE VISUAL AND PERFORMING ARTS SCHOLARSHIP

1. The Delavan-Darien Friends of the Visual and Performing Arts is an organization dedicated to the promotion of all the arts found within the school district community. This group supports the arts by sponsoring events, fundraising and assisting artistic endeavors, utilizing a variety of means. This scholarship is given in the spirit of continuing the groups' goals, encouraging and helping those who pursue the arts through enrollment in post-secondary education.
2. The Delavan-Darien Friends of the Visual and Performing Arts Award shall be presented annually at the Delavan-Darien High School commencement exercises to a member of the graduating class.
3. The award shall be based upon applications submitted by seniors who plan to enroll at any type of post-secondary school.
4. Applicants shall be judged on the quality of their scholastic performance and sincerity of purpose in pursuing a career in the visual, musical or performing arts.
5. Financial need shall be a consideration only when other qualifications are considered to be equal.
6. The recipient shall be selected by the Friends of the Visual and Performing Arts group.
7. This award shall be a one-year award in the amount of \$1,500, or two awards of \$1,000
8. The award shall be paid upon proof of the recipient's enrollment for the fall semester as a full-time student.

DELAVAN-DARIEN GRIDIRON CLUB AWARD

1. The Delavan-Darien Gridiron Club Award will be presented to a graduating senior at the Commencement exercises.
2. The award will be based on applications submitted by a senior who plans on attending any type of post secondary school.
3. The criteria upon which the candidates will be judged are:
 - a. Four years of participation in the Delavan-Darien Football Program
 - b. Dedication to the team
 - c. Sportsmanship
 - d. Leadership
 - e. Self-control
 - f. Attitude
4. The head coach, offensive and defensive coordinators, and the athletic director will select the recipient.
5. The awards will be in the amount of \$1000 for one year split into two payments of \$500 each semester.
6. The award will be paid upon proof of the recipient's enrollment for the semester directly to the student.

DELAVAN-DARIEN MASONIC SCHOLARSHIP

1. The Delavan-Darien Masonic Scholarships shall be presented annually at the Delavan-Darien High School commencement exercises to a member of the graduating class.
2. The awards will be based on applications submitted by seniors from an accredited Wisconsin High School who plan to attend a four-year college, technical school or junior college.
3. Applicants will be judged on their promise as a student and on service to their school or community.
4. The recipient shall be selected by the High School counselors based on the criteria provided by Southern Lakes Masonic Lodge. Preference may be given to students with a Masonic affiliation in their families, such as Eastern Star, DeMolay, Job's Daughters, Shrine, Blue Lodge, York or Scottish Rite and others. Proof of this affiliation must be included with application.
5. This award is a one-year award in the amount of \$1,000.
6. The award shall be paid upon proof of matriculation in the school of the recipient's choice.
7. The award shall be made available to the winner upon matriculation in college.

DELAVAN-DARIEN OPTIMIST CLUB AWARDS

1. The Delavan-Darien Optimist Club Awards shall be presented annually at the Delavan-Darien High School Commencement exercises to a member of the graduating class.
2. The awards shall be based upon applications submitted by seniors who plan to enroll in any type of post-secondary school.
3. Applicants shall be judged on the quality of their scholastic performance, sincerity of purpose, promise as a student and school citizenship.
4. Financial need shall be a consideration only when other qualifications are considered equal.
5. The recipients shall be selected by a member of the Optimist Club, with input from the Delavan-Darien High School Student Services Department.
6. These awards shall be one-year awards in the amount of \$1,000. Two (2) awards were given out in 2011.
7. These awards shall be paid upon proof of matriculation in the school of the recipient's choice.

DELAVAN-DARIEN ROTARY CLUB AWARDS

(Created 1970)

(Revised 3/28/90)

1. The Delavan-Darien Rotary Club Awards shall be presented at the Commencement exercises of the Delavan-Darien High School to a member of the graduating class.
2. Two (2) \$1,000 awards shall be presented. One award shall be based upon an application submitted by a graduating senior who plans to enroll in a vocational or a technical program in a public vocational or technical school. Applicants for this award must pursue either a one-year or a two-year program of studies. Programs of less than one year are not eligible programs.

The second award shall be based on an application submitted by a graduating senior who plans to enroll in either a two-year vocational/technical program or a four-year college or university degree program.

3. Financial need shall be a consideration in the selection of the Delavan-Darien Rotary Club Award recipients.
4. The vocational/technical award recipient(s) shall be determined by a committee as follows:
 - a. the high school guidance director
 - b. two vocational/technical education teachers
 - c. the high school principal or his/her representative
 - d. a member of the Delavan-Darien Rotary Club

The college/university award recipient (if any) shall be determined by a committee as follows:

- a. the high school guidance director
 - b. the high school principal or his/her representative
 - c. a member of the Delavan-Darien Rotary Club
5. The criteria upon which the candidates shall be judged are:
 - a. quality of high school work and promise as a student. It is intended that the award recipient need not necessarily be a top-ranking student if, in the judgment of the committee, his/her high school grades and general conduct suggest proper motivation and attitude and the probability of the successful completion of his/her chosen course of study.
 - b. ability or aptitude in the course chosen.
 - d. wholesomeness and good citizenship.
 - e. Community service.
6. For each award, \$500 shall be paid to the winner upon matriculation at the school of his/her choice. An additional \$500 shall be paid at the start of the second semester upon receipt of the recipient's first semester grades showing successful achievement and progress in his/her program of studies.

THE DELAVAN-DARIEN YOUTH WRESTLING CLUB SCHOLARSHIP

(Created 4/2010)

1. The DD Youth Wrestling Club Scholarship shall be presented annually at the Delavan-Darien High School commencement exercises to a member of the graduating class.
2. The scholarship shall be based upon applications submitted by graduating seniors who plan to enroll in any type of post-secondary education.
3. Applications shall be judged on the number of years with the wrestling program, individuals must have participated a minimum of 2 years with the DD High School Wrestling program, with a preference given to those that have wrestled for more time than that; scholastic performance; sincerity of purpose and community citizenship.
4. The recipient of the award shall be selected by a committee of high school administrators and members of the DD Youth Wrestling Club.
5. The award shall be a one-year award, with a minimum award amount of \$500.00.
6. The award shall be paid upon proof of enrollment in the fall semester.

DORA S. ARTHUR FINANCIAL AID FUND

(Created 1965-66)
(Revised, January, 1991)

The will of Dora S. Arthur provides for the establishment of a financial aid fund for deserving Delavan-Darien High School graduates. According to her wishes, not more than \$1,000 of the fund shall be used annually for this purpose, and the nature and scope of the financial aid program shall be left to the discretion of the Delavan-Darien Board of Education.

1. The Dora S. Arthur Awards shall be presented annually at the Delavan-Darien High School Commencement exercises to graduating seniors.
2. The awards shall be based upon applications submitted by seniors who plan to enroll in any type of accredited post-secondary program of one year or more. Preference shall be given to seniors continuing their education in a post-secondary program other than a four-year college program. However, if qualified applicants for non-college degree programs are not available, the Dora S. Arthur awards may be presented to graduating seniors who plan to attend a four-year college degree program.
3. The applicants shall be judged on the following criteria:
 - a) quality of high school work
 - b) promise as a student
 - c) good citizenship
 - d) sincerity of purpose
4. Financial need shall be a consideration only when other qualifications are considered to be equal.
5. The award winners shall be selected by a committee consisting of:
 - a) a school board member designated by the Board President
 - b) Superintendent of Schools
 - c) High School Principal
 - d) Director of Pupil Services
 - e) Business Education Teacher
6. One Dora S. Arthur award will be presented in 2011. The value of this scholarship is determined annually by the Board of Education. For 2011, the amount of the scholarship shall be \$500.
7. The awards shall be paid upon proof of matriculation at the school of the recipient's choice.

FAIRFIELD GRANGE SCHOLARSHIP

1. The Fairfield Grange Scholarship shall be presented annually at the Delavan-Darien High School Commencement exercises to a member of the graduating class.
2. The award shall be based on applications submitted by seniors who plan to attend some type of educational institution beyond high school. The field of study must be related to Agriculture or Family and Consumer Economics.
3. Applicants shall be judged on the quality of their scholastic performance, sincerity of purpose, promise as a student, community service and school citizenship.
4. There will be two(2) \$1,000 awards offered this year.
5. Members of the Fairfield Grange and the high school counselors will select the recipient.
6. The award shall be paid by the Fairfield Grange to the recipient after proof of school enrollment in the fall.

FLORENCE DUNWIDDIE MEMORIAL FUND

(Created 5/71)

- 1 The Florence Dunwiddie Memorial Award shall be awarded at the Commencement exercises of the Delavan-Darien High School to a male or female member of the graduating class.
2. The award shall be based upon applications submitted by twelfth grade students who plan to attend any type of post-secondary school and to enroll in a medical or related field. Examples of acceptable areas of study include nursing, occupational therapy, physical therapy, medical social work, X-ray technology, medical technology, audiology, speech pathology, inhalation therapy, dental hygiene, operating room assistant, optometry, dental lab technology, pharmacy, dietetics, medical record librarian, medical secretary, and pre-medicine or pre-dentistry.
3. The award winner shall be determined by a committee consisting of:
 - a. the high school principal
 - b. a member of the school board
 - c. a high school counselor
 - d. the high school nurse
4. Candidates shall be judged on the following:
 - a. quality of high school work and promise as a student
 - b. ability or aptitude in the course chosen
 - c. sincerity of purpose
 - d. citizenship and character
5. Financial need shall be a consideration only when other qualifications are considered to be equal.
6. This award shall be a one-year award in the amount of the interest earned on the principal in the Florence Dunwiddie Memorial fund. The amount of the award will be \$500.
7. The award shall be paid to the recipient upon matriculation in the school of his or her choice.
8. This statement of policy is subject to change at the discretion of the Board of Education.

JACQUELINE YANKE MEMORIAL

1. A \$300 award in memory of Jacqueline Yanke shall be presented to a member of the senior class.
2. The award shall be based on applications submitted by seniors who intend to enroll in any type of post-high school educational program. There is no specific requirement in regard to major or type of school.
3. Applicants need not be top-ranking students. They must, however, have shown themselves to have respect for scholarship and a wholesome attitude toward their classes. They must, furthermore, have been good school citizens and have demonstrated those qualities that would tend to predict a future usefulness on their part to business and society.
4. Financial need shall be a consideration only when other qualifications are equal.
5. The recipient shall be selected by the high school counselors.
6. The award shall be paid to the recipient upon matriculation in the school of his or her choice.

JANET LYNN BOSS MEMORIAL AWARD

1. The Janet Lynn Boss Memorial Award shall be presented at the Delavan-Darien High School commencement exercises to a member of the graduating class.
2. The award shall be based upon applications submitted by seniors who plan to enroll in any type of post-secondary school.
3. Applicants shall be judged on the quality of their scholastic performance, sincerity of purpose, promise as a student, and school citizenship.
4. Financial need shall be a consideration only when other qualifications are considered equal.
5. The recipient shall be selected by the high school guidance department and members of the Boss/Pyrz families. Final selection will be determined by the families.
6. This award shall be an annual award in the amount of \$500.
7. The award shall be paid upon proof of matriculation in the school of the recipient's choice.

THE KAY WAELTI MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND

(Created 3/ 2011)

1. The Kay Waelti Memorial Scholarship shall be awarded to a graduating senior at the commencement exercises of Delavan-Darien High School.
2. The scholarship shall be awarded to a student attending a university, college, technical or trade school, or a vocational training program as either a full or part-time student.
3. The application shall contain a statement of community service completed by the applicant; a resume of work experience (compensated and uncompensated); and a paragraph describing the student's goals, educational philosophy and special interests.
4. The scholarship shall be given to a student who has a grade point average of 2.0-3.4.
5. Financial need shall not be a factor in the selection of a recipient.
6. The Waelti Family along with the Delavan-Darien High School Counselors shall select the recipient of this award. If the committee determines that no one meets the award qualifications the award will not be offered.
7. The committee may change the criteria if necessary in consultation with the Waelti family.
8. The amount of this yearly award shall be around \$1,000 and a minimum of \$500.
9. The award check will be issued in the name of both the student and the school they are attending upon proof of enrollment.

KIKKOMAN FOODS, INC. SCHOLARSHIP

(Created 6/87)

1. The Kikkoman Foods, Inc. Scholarship shall be presented annually at the Delavan-Darien High School Commencement exercises to a senior boy or girl who plans to continue his education beyond high school.
2. The award shall be based upon applications submitted by twelfth grade students who plan to enroll in any type of accredited post-secondary school. This could include a 4-year college, a school of nursing, a business school, a trade or technical school, or any other accredited school providing training of shorter duration. Applicants for this award may pursue any major of their choosing.
3. Applicants shall be judged upon the following criteria:
 - a) quality of scholastic performance
 - b) sincerity of purpose
 - c) promise as a student
 - d) wholesomeness and good citizenship
 - e) leadership and service to the school as demonstrated by participation in the extracurricular activities of the school
4. Financial need shall be a consideration only when other qualifications are considered to be equal.
5. The winner shall be selected by a committee consisting of:
 - a) the high school administrators
 - b) the high school counselors
6. This award shall be a one-year award in the amount of \$3,000.
7. The award shall be paid by the Kikkoman Foods, Inc. to the recipient upon matriculation in the school of his or her choice.

LAKELAND MEDICAL CENTER MEDICAL STAFF SCHOLARSHIP

1. The Lakeland Medical Center Medical Staff scholarship shall be presented annually at the Delavan-Darien High School Commencement exercises to a member of the graduating class.
2. The award shall be based upon applications submitted by seniors who plan to enroll in any type of post-secondary program in a health-related field.
3. Applicants shall be judged on the quality of their scholastic performance, sincerity of purpose, promise as a student, and school citizenship.
4. Financial need shall be a consideration only when other qualifications are considered equal.
5. The recipient of the award shall be selected by the high school guidance department and administration.
6. There will be two \$1,000 awards or one \$2,000 award for this year.
7. The award shall be paid upon proof of matriculation in the school of the recipient's choice.

THE LYNDA COOPER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

(Created 4/10)

1. The Lynda Cooper Memorial Scholarship shall be presented annually at the Delavan-Darien High School commencement exercises to a member of the graduating class.
2. The award shall be based upon applications submitted by graduating seniors who plan to enroll in a post secondary program. Preference will be given to students with special needs, students pursuing a degree in special education, or students going into education in general.
3. Applicants for the award must demonstrate good citizenship and school and community service.
4. Financial need shall be a consideration only when other qualifications are considered equal.
5. The Darien Woman's Club shall choose a recipient.
6. The award shall be a one-time award in the amount of \$500.
7. The award shall be paid to the recipient second semester upon proof of enrollment as a full-time student.

THE MARV SHEPARD MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

1. Applicant must have bowled as a member of the bowling club, or any other sanctioned bowling league, or volunteered as a youth bowling coach or instructor.
2. The Marv Shepard Memorial Scholarship shall be presented at the commencement exercises to a member of the graduating class.
3. The award shall be based upon applications submitted by seniors who plan to enroll in any type of post-secondary program.
4. Applicants shall be judged on their scholastic performance, promise as a student, school citizenship and participation in school and community activities.
5. Financial need shall only be a consideration when other factors are equal.
6. The student services department, an administrator and a representative of the Delavan Bowling community shall select the recipient.
7. This award shall be a one-time award in the amount of \$1,000.
8. The award shall be paid to the recipient upon proof of enrollment during the fall semester.

NATIONAL SCHOOL ORCHESTRA ASSOCIATION

ORCHESTRA AWARD

(Created 4/89)

1. An award shall be given by the high school orchestra to a senior who has demonstrated outstanding musicianship, leadership, attitude, and dedication to the orchestra and its activities during four years. The recipient is to be selected by the director and the orchestra members.
2. The scholarship is to be given to a student who will be pursuing a college degree. The recipient does not have to major or minor in music, but must continue to further his/her musical ability by playing in an orchestral or string ensemble.
3. The amount of the award is \$500.
4. Payment will be made in the fall after the recipient has provided evidence of enrollment and participation in an orchestral or string ensemble.

PENTAIR WATER SCHOLARSHIP

To be awarded by
PENTAIR WATER DELAVAN

1. The PENTAIR WATER Scholarship shall be awarded at the Commencement exercises of Delavan-Darien High School to a graduating senior who ranks in the top 5% of his or her graduating class.
2. The award shall be based upon applications submitted by twelfth grade students who have indicated interest in enrolling in a four-year accredited college. Applicants for this award may pursue any major of their choosing.

 - e) competitive spirit
6. The PENTAIR WATER Scholarship shall be a four-year award with an annual cash value of \$2,000 to the recipient. The award shall be made available to the graduate selected upon matriculation in college and following September first. It shall be re-awarded each year to the recipient upon receipt of his/her college record showing successful achievement and progress in his/her courses until the total \$8,000 has been awarded.

RED DEVIL YOUTH FOOTBALL SCHOLARSHIP

(Created 3/05)

1. The Red Devil Youth Scholarship shall be presented annually at the Delavan-Darien High School commencement exercises to a member of the graduating class.
2. The scholarship shall be based upon applications submitted by seniors who plan to enroll in a college, a university of education, or a technical school.
3. The scholarship shall be a one-year award in the amount of \$500.
4. The criteria shall be that the person applying for the scholarship has:
 - a. Participated in the Red Devils Program a minimum of 1 year.
 - b. Participated in the Delavan-Darien High School Football or Cheerleading Program a minimum of 3 years.
 - c. Maintained a 2.5 GPA.

ROBERT LABONNE SCHOLARSHIP

(Created 5/90)

1. The Robert Labonne Scholarship shall be presented at the Delavan-Darien High School Commencement exercises to a member of the graduating class.
2. The scholarship shall be based upon applications submitted by seniors who plan to seek technical or vocational training in the areas of metals, welding, woodworking, plumbing, automotive and/or a related occupation. This training will be done at an educational institution other than a four-year college or university.
3. Applicants shall be judged on the quality of their scholastic performance, sincerity or purpose, promise as a student, and school citizenship.
4. The winner shall be selected by the high school vocational instructors after considering input from the Labonne family.
5. This scholarship shall be an annual one-time award in the amount of \$400 (whatever interest has accumulated), or it may be carried over to a subsequent year or years if there are no qualified applicants.
6. The scholarship shall be paid by the Delavan-Darien School District directly to the instructional institution, upon receipt of proof of school enrollment.

SHERRY L. ROZELL MEMORIAL AWARD

(Created 6/73)

1. The Sherry L. Rozell Memorial Award shall be awarded at the Commencement exercises of Delavan-Darien High School to a male or female member of the graduating class.
2. The award shall be based upon applications submitted by twelfth grade students who intend to further their education by majoring in some phase of the business field.
3. An applicant for this award must plan to attend a business school or a four-year college.
4. An applicant for this award must also be a FBLA member in good standing for at least one school year.
5. An applicant for this award must also have taken at least four business courses throughout their high school term. Transfer students may include all of their business courses taken in previous high school years with the requirement of at least one business course in this high school.
6. The award winner shall be determined by a committee consisting of:
 - a. All the business education department teachers.
 - b. The president of FBLA - if the president is up for the award, then the vice-president; and so on down the line.
7. The Sherry L. Rozell Memorial Award shall be a one-year award valued at \$500.
8. The award shall be made available to the winner upon matriculation in the school of his or her choice.

SPX FLOW TECHNOLOGY, DELAVAN OPERATIONS SCHOLARSHIP

1. The SPX Flow Technology, Delavan Operations Scholarship shall be presented annually at the Delavan-Darien High School Commencement exercises to a member of the graduating class.
2. The scholarship shall be based upon applications submitted by graduating seniors who plan to enroll in any type of post-secondary education, with a focus on engineering or business administration.
3. Applications shall be judged on the quality of their scholastic performance, sincerity of purpose, promise as a student and community citizenship.
4. The recipient of this award shall be selected by a committee of high school counselors and administrators.
5. This shall be a one-year award in the amount of \$5,000.
6. The award shall be paid upon proof of enrollment in the fall semester.

VINCENT JAMES AGIUS MEMORIAL

(Created 10/79)

1. A \$300 award in memory of Vincent James Agius shall be presented to member of the senior class.
2. The award shall be based on applications submitted by seniors who intend to enroll in any type of post-high school educational program. There is no specific requirement in regard to major or type of school.
3. Applicants need not be top-ranking students. They must, however, have shown themselves to have respect for scholarship and a wholesome attitude toward their classes. They must, furthermore, have been good school citizens and have demonstrated those qualities that would tend to predict a future usefulness on their part to business and society.
4. Financial need shall be a consideration only when other qualifications are equal.
5. The winner shall be selected by high school counselors.
6. The award shall be paid to the recipient upon matriculation in the school of his or her choice.

The following general criteria are considered in awarding scholarships and awards:

- a. Promise as a student and rank in the upper half of the graduating class.
- b. Participation in the co-curricular activity program, which in some cases may be specific depending upon the wishes of the donor.
- c. Other characteristics to include sincerity of purpose, and evidence of good school and community citizenship.
- d. Financial need is considered when all other qualifications are equal.
- e. Foundation scholarships are payable in the fall of the year when the Foundation Treasurer has received a fees paid receipt or a letter from the registrar as proof of enrollment, unless otherwise specified.

Specific Criteria and Information for Foundation scholarships can be found on the following pages.

THE BURDETTE W. HOLT MEMORIAL AWARD

- a. The Burdette W. Holt award is a one-year award given to a member of the graduating class. The award shall be based upon applications submitted by seniors who rank in the upper half of their graduating class and plan to enroll in any type of post-secondary education studying agriculture or an agriculture-related field. Applicants shall be judged on their quality of purpose, promise as a student and school citizenship. Financial need shall be a consideration only when other qualifications are considered equal.
- b. This is a one-year award in the amount of \$250.

THE CHARLES WILEMAN MEMORIAL AWARD

- a. The recipient of this award shall be a member of the graduating class who plans on enrolling in a four-year degree program at an accredited college or university in the field of education. Candidates must rank in the upper 25% of the graduating class. Participating in at least one co-curricular activity during their high school career is required of applicants to be considered for this scholarship.
- b. This is a two-year cash award of \$750. \$500 will be paid in year one and \$250 in year two.

THE CLAUDE & KATHRYN DAVIS FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

(Created 10/07)

- a. The Claude and Kathryn Davis Family Scholarship shall be presented annually at the Delavan-Darien High School commencement exercises to a member of the graduating class.
- b. The award shall be based upon applications submitted by graduating seniors who plan to enroll in a four-year college program.
- c. Applicants must have demonstrated good character and strong academic achievement. Preference will be given to a student who is the first member of his/her immediate family to attend college and/or a student whose parent is or was a disabled member of the U.S. Armed Forces who served in Iraq or Afghanistan.
- d. Financial need shall be a consideration only when other qualifications are considered to be equal.
- e. The Student Services Department at Delavan-Darien High School shall recommend a recipient to the board of directors of the Delavan-Darien School District Foundation for board approval.
- f. The amount of the award shall be \$4,000, with payments of \$1,000 per year.
- g. Each award shall be paid to the recipient upon proof of enrollment as a full time student for the fall semester of the freshman year and upon proof of both enrollment and satisfactory

THE COMMUNITY BANK AWARDS

- a. The Community Bank Awards shall be presented annually at the Delavan-Darien High School Commencement exercises to a member of the graduating class. The award shall be based upon applications submitted by seniors who plan to enroll in any type of post-secondary school. Applicants shall be judged on the quality of purpose, promise as a student and school citizenship. Financial need shall be a consideration only when other qualifications are considered equal.
- b. These are two-year cash awards in the amount of \$2,000, with \$1,000 being paid each fall upon proof of enrollment in school and, after the first year, showing successful academic progress in their studies.

THE DARIEN CORN FESTIVAL CHUCK AND SU BROWN MEMORIAL AWARD

- a. The recipient of this award shall be a member of the graduating class who ranks in the upper half of the class and plans on enrolling in any type of post-secondary education. Candidates must have displayed a community-minded spirit through active volunteer work with the Darien Corn Festival or other community groups. Additionally, candidates must have demonstrated a strong commitment to high school athletics by participating in at least one athletic sport for two or more seasons.
- b. This is a one-year cash award in the amount of \$1,000.

THE DELAVAN JUNIOR WOMAN'S CLUB AWARD

- a. The Delavan Junior Woman's Club award will be presented at the Delavan-Darien High School commencement exercises to a member of the graduating class. The award shall be based upon applications submitted by seniors who plan to enroll in any type of post-secondary education. Applicants shall be judged on quality of high school work, social attitude, school citizenship and community service. Financial need shall be a consideration only when other qualifications are considered equal.
- b. This is a one-year cash award in the amount of \$1,000.

THE DELAVAN-DARIEN FOUNDATION EDUCATION AWARD

- a. The recipient of this award shall be a member of the graduating class who plans on enrolling in a four-year college or university in the field of education.
- b. Applications shall be judged on their promise as a student, leadership and school citizenship.
- c. Preference will be given to students who have a 3.0 or higher GPA and have been active in school activities.
- d. This is a one-year in the amount of \$1,000.

THE DELAVAN-DARIEN FOUNDATION MEMORIAL AWARDS

Each year, in addition to the specific awards that have been announced in this summary, the Foundation annually provides a minimum of ten (10) memorial grants from funds given to the organization. These funds are given to the Foundation both as memorials to individuals as well as by alumni and citizens of the communities who have made a commitment to assist graduates in pursuing their education beyond high school.

- a. The recipients of these awards will be selected from applications submitted by the graduating class who plan on enrolling in a four-year degree program.
- b. These are one-year cash awards valued at \$1,000 each.

SELECTION OF RECIPIENTS

Recipients of awards selected by the DELAVAN-DARIEN SCHOOL DISTRICT FOUNDATION Board of Directors are made after consultation and reviewing recommendations of department heads, teachers, principals, and the Student Services staff.

PAYMENT OF SCHOLARSHIPS/AWARDS

Payments of all scholarships and awards are made to the recipient upon proof of enrollment in the form of a fees paid receipt from the school of his/her choice or a letter from the registrar. Proof of enrollment is to be sent to the Student Services Office at Delavan-Darien High School after September 1st.

THE DOUG KAHL MEMORIAL AWARD

- a. The recipient of this award shall be a member of the graduating class who will be enrolling in a four-year degree program in education.
- b. This is a one-year cash award in the amount of \$500.

THE DONALD EDMUNDS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

(Created 4/2009)

- a. The Donald Edmunds Memorial Scholarship shall be awarded to a graduating senior at the commencement exercises of Delavan-Darien High school.
- b. The award shall be given to a graduating senior who plans on enrolling in a four-year college degree program in education or a science/related field, or in a technical college in a medical-related field such as paramedic, certified nursing assistant, nursing or medical technician.
- c. Candidates for this award shall demonstrate above-average academic performance, good citizenship, and a record of school and/or community service.
- d. Financial need shall be a consideration only when other factors are equal.
- e. The Student Services Department and Administration of Delavan-Darien High School shall recommend a candidate for the award to the Delavan-Darien School District Foundation Board of Directors.
- f. The amount of this award is \$500.00.
- g. The award shall be paid to the recipient upon proof of enrollment as a full-time student in the postsecondary school of his/her choice.

EUGENE SCHMIG MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

- a. The Eugene Schmig Memorial Scholarship shall be awarded to a graduating senior at the commencement exercises of Delavan-Darien High School.
- b. The award shall be given to a graduating senior who plans on enrolling in a four-year college degree program in education or another helping profession.
- c. Candidates for this award shall demonstrate above-average academic performance, good citizenship, and a record of school and/or community service.
- d. Financial need shall be a consideration only when other factors are equal.
- e. The Student Services Department and Administration of Delavan-Darien High School shall recommend a candidate for the award to the Delavan-Darien School District Foundation Board of Directors.
- f. The amount of this award is \$1,000.00.
- g. The award shall be paid to the recipient upon proof of enrollment as a full-time student in the postsecondary school of his/her choice.

THE GENE SHREVES AWARD

- a. This award is open to students who plan on enrolling in either a four-year degree or a vocational diploma program of not less than one year. Participants on either the girls or boys golf teams would receive preference.
- a. This is a one-year cash award in the amount of \$2,000, or two awards in the amount of \$1,000.

THE GLEN HOLMAN AWARD

- a. The award shall be based upon an application submitted by twelfth grade students who plan to enroll in either a four-year degree program or vocational diploma program of not less than one school year in an agriculture-related field of study. An agricultural extension course equivalent to one year of study would also meet this requirement. Participation is required in two independent fields of extra-curricular activities, one of which should include membership in the FFA during his/her high school career.
- b. This is a one-year cash award in the amount of \$1,000.

THE HOWARD KNAPP AWARD

- a. This award shall be made based upon the applications submitted by members of the twelfth grade graduating class who plan to enroll in either a four-year degree program or a vocational diploma program of not less than one school year.
- b. This is a one-year cash award in the amount of \$600.

THE IRVIN C. AND HARRIETT B. LLEWELLYN AWARD

- a. The Irvin C. and Harriett B. Llewellyn award will be presented annually at the Delavan-Darien High School commencement exercises to a member of the graduating class. The award shall be based upon applications submitted by seniors who plan to enroll at an accredited technical, vocational or four-year college. Applicants shall be judged on the quality of their scholastic performance, sincerity of purpose, promise as a student and school citizenship. Financial need shall be a consideration only when other qualifications are considered equal.
- b. This is a one-year cash award in the amount of \$1,000. Two (2) awards will be presented this year.

THE KATHLEEN FREDERICK READER MEMORIAL AWARD

- a. The recipient of this award shall rank in the upper 50% of the graduating class and will enroll in a four-year college or university degree program. Applicants shall be judged on their character, school citizenship and their participant in the instrumental music program. Financial need shall be a consideration only when other factors are equal.
- b. This is a one-year cash award in the amount of \$1,000.

THE MARGARET STURTEVANT AUSTIN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

- a. The Margaret Sturtevant Austin Memorial Scholarship shall be presented annually at the Delavan-Darien High School commencement exercises to a member of the graduating class.
- b. The award shall be based upon applications submitted by graduating seniors who plan to enroll in a four-year degree college or university program in the field of education.
- c. Applicants for the award must rank in the top half of the graduating class and demonstrate good citizenship, school and community service and involvement in school activities.
- d. Financial need shall be a consideration in the selection of the recipient.
- e. The student services department with the input from the Austin family shall recommend the recipient to the board of directors of the Delavan-Darien School District Foundation.
- f. The award shall be a one-time award in the amount of \$1,000.
- g. The award shall be paid to the recipient upon proof of enrollment during the fall semester.

THE MARY AUSTIN MEEUWSEN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

(Created 3/05)

- a. The Mary Austin Meeuwsen Memorial Scholarship shall be presented annually at the Delavan-Darien High School commencement exercises to a member of the graduating class.
- b. The award shall be based upon applications submitted by graduating seniors who plan to enroll in a four-year degree college or university program in the field of elementary education.
- c. Applicants for the award must rank in the top half of the graduating class and demonstrate good citizenship, school and community service and involvement in school activities.
- d. Financial need shall be a consideration in the selection of the recipient.
- e. The student services department with the input from the Austin family shall recommend the recipient to the board of directors of the Delavan-Darien School district Foundation.
- f. The award shall be a one-time award in the amount of \$1,000.
- g. The award shall be paid to the recipient upon proof of enrollment during the fall

semester.

THE MAX SCHMALING MEMORIAL AWARD

- a. The recipient of this award shall be a member of the graduating class who plans on enrolling in a four-year degree program at an accredited college or university. Candidates must rank in the upper half of the graduating class, must be of good character, show sincerity of purpose, and must have indicated by their past record that they have the potential to achieve success in a degree program.
- b. This is a one-year cash award in the amount of \$1,000.

THE McGINNIS EDUCATION AWARD

- a. The McGinnis Education award will be presented at the Delavan-Darien High School commencement exercises to a member of the graduating class. The award shall be based upon applications submitted by seniors who plan to enroll in an accredited four-year degree program in the field of education. Applicants shall be judged on sincerity of purpose, school citizenship and community service.
- b. This is a one-year cash award in the amount of \$1,000.

THE MERLIN MOSER AWARD

- a. The recipient of this award shall be a member of the graduating class who plans on enrolling in either a two-year associate degree program or a four-year college program. Candidates must rank in the top 50% of the graduating class and will be judged on their promise as a student, their school citizenship, and participation in at least one extra-curricular activity. Financial need shall be a consideration only when other qualifications are considered equal.
- b. One or more awards may be given with the amount to be determined annually. In 2011 (2) \$1,000 awards will be presented.

THE MICHAEL J. DILLNER MEMORIAL AWARD

- a. The Michael J. Dillner award(s) will be presented annually to seniors who wish to enroll in a technical education program rather than in a four-year college or university. Applicants shall be judged on their sincerity of purpose, character and promise as a student.
- b. One or more awards may be given with the amount to be determined annually. In 2011, two awards valued at \$600 each will be presented.

THE RICHARD MCCLELLAN SMITH MEMORIAL AWARD

- a. The Richard McClellan Smith Memorial Award shall be presented annually at the Delavan-Darien High School Commencement exercises to a member of the graduating class. The award shall be based upon applications submitted by seniors who plan to enroll in any type of post-secondary school. Applicants shall be judged on the quality of purpose, promise as a student and school citizenship. Financial need shall be a consideration only when other qualifications are considered equal.
- b. This is a one-year award in the amount of \$500.

THE ROBERT MICHAEL KOVAL MEMORIAL AWARD

- a. Candidates for this award are required to pursue education in the arts, including music, drama, speech, visual arts, and dance. In addition, consideration will be given to students who plan on being a candidate for a degree in education. It is noted that candidates for a degree in technical or vocational education would not be eligible.
- b. This is a one-year cash award in the amount of \$500.

THE STEPHANIE ROHERTY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

(Created 3/05)

- a. The Stephanie Roherty memorial Scholarship shall be presented annually at the Delavan-Darien High School commencement exercises to a member of the graduating class.
- b. Two awards shall be presented. Each award shall be based upon applications submitted by graduating seniors who plan to enroll in any type of postsecondary education program.
- c. Applicants for the awards must have a 3.0 or higher grade point average and demonstrate good citizenship, school and community service an involvement in school activities.
- d. Financial need shall be a consideration only when other qualifications are to be considered equal.
- e. The student services department with input from the Sawtelle family shall recommend recipients to the board of directors of the Delavan-Darien School District Foundation.
- f. Each award will be a one-time award in the amount of \$500.
- g. Each award shall be paid to the recipient upon proof of enrollment during the fall

semester.

THE WALLACE ZIMMERMANN MEMORIAL AWARD

- a. The recipient of this award shall be a member of the graduating class who plans on enrolling in a four-year degree program at an accredited college or university. Candidates must rank in the upper 25% of the graduating class, have been good school and community citizens, and have indicated by their past academic performance that they have the potential to achieve success in the field of education. Preference will be given to candidates who participated in at least two (2) interscholastic sports for two seasons each.
- b. This is a one-year cash award in the amount of \$1,000.

WALWORTH STATE BANK SCHOLARSHIP

(created 5/06)

- a. The Walworth State Bank Scholarship shall be presented annually at the Delavan-Darien High School commencement exercises to a member of the graduating class.
- b. The award shall be based upon applications submitted by graduating seniors who plan to enroll in either a two year associate degree program or a four year bachelor's degree program.
- c. Applicants for the award must demonstrate promise as a student, good citizenship and both school and community service.
- d. Financial need shall be a consideration only when other qualifications are considered to be equal.
- e. The student services department and administration shall recommend a recipient to the board of directors of the Delavan-Darien School District Foundation.
- f. The award shall be a one-time amount of \$1,000.
- g. The award shall be paid in two installments. The first installment shall be paid upon proof of the recipient's successful completion of the first semester of postsecondary studies. The second installment shall be paid upon proof of successful completion of the second semester of postsecondary studies.

THE WILLIAM L. FLECK MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

(created 3/06)

- a. The William L. Fleck Memorial Scholarship shall be presented annually at the Delavan-Darien High School commencement exercises to a member of the graduating class.
- b. The award shall be based upon applications submitted by graduating seniors who plan to enroll in any type of post-secondary education plan.
- c. Applicants for the award must demonstrate academic promise and good citizenship.
- d. Financial need shall be considered only when other qualifications are considered to be equal.
- e. The student services department and the Fleck family shall recommend a recipient to the board of directors of the Delavan-Darien School district Foundation.
- f. The award shall be a one-time award in the amount of \$1,000.
- g. The award shall be paid in two installments. The first payment shall be made to the recipient upon proof of enrollment as a full-time student. The second payment shall be made at the beginning of the second year of the recipient's program upon proof of enrollment as a full-time student and proof of acceptable academic progress in that program of study.

THE WILMA LAUTERBACH MEMORIAL AWARD

- a. The recipient of this award shall be a member of the graduating class who plans on enrolling in a four-year degree program at an accredited college or university. The candidates during their high school career should have participated in one or more community service programs, and at least one co-curricular activity per school year during their four years in high school. The candidates should have been good school citizens and sincere and diligent students, who rank in the upper 25% of the graduating class.
- b. This is a one-year cash award in the amount of \$1,000.

ZACHARY BUTLER SCHOLARSHIP

(Created 3/2011)

- a. The Zachary Butler Scholarship shall be awarded to a graduating senior at the commencement exercises of Delavan-Darien High School.
- b. The award shall be given to a graduating senior who plans on enrolling in a bachelor's degree or associate's degree college program.
- c. Candidates for this award shall demonstrate good citizenship, a record of school and/or community service and the potential to serve **humanity in their chosen career path. It is requested that the recipient write a brief summary upon completion of their studies as to how they plan to help humanity.**
- d. Financial need shall be considered only when other factors are equal.
- e. The Student Services Department and Administration of Delavan-Darien High School shall recommend a candidate for the award to the Delavan-Darien School District Foundation Board of Directors.
- f. The amount of the award is \$1,000.00.
- g. The award shall be paid to the recipient upon proof of enrollment as a full-time student in the postsecondary school of his/her choice.
